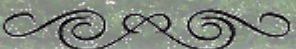


When I'm Gone

Jo Ann Murray, age 66, Dallas, TX, formerly of Garden City, died peacefully on Tuesday evening, September 3, 2019, in the Faith Presbyterian Hospice in Dallas after a lingering cancer illness.

Jo Ann Murray was born on December 31, 1952, at Watertown, actually in the back seat of a Chevy on Highway 212, New Year's Eve!, the daughter of Joseph F and Dorothy Ar-delle (Spencer) Murray.
