
The Broken Chain

Lee Andrew Jones, 87 years of age, went to be with his Lord on Sunday, November 23, 2025.

Lee, a.k.a., "Uncle Lee," as he was affectionately known, was born March 19, 1938, in Hampstead, North Carolina, as the youngest son of the late Nathan and Hettie Nixon Jones. He was married to the late Mary Thomas Jones. To this union four children were born.

Uncle Lee was preceded in death by his oldest son, Anthony Thomas; and siblings, Raeford Jones, Violetha Brown, Sampson Jones, Hattie Mae Jones, Judith Austin, Margaret Bragg, and Emma Jacobs.

He was educated in the Pender County public schools and was the first in his family to graduate. Shortly after graduating, he moved to Ellenville, New York, and shortly thereafter, he was drafted Into the United States Army.

After serving in the military, Uncle Lee attended barber school in New York and became the sole proprietor of Lee's Barber Shop.

He resided in many places including but not limited to Kentucky, Alabama, and Georgia before returning to North Carolina.

After thirty years of dedicated service at Hercifina Chemicals in Wilmington, North Carolina, as a plant operator, Uncle Lee retired in 1999.
