Lyle Victor Vandenberg was born January 24, 1932, to Gertie (Brandt) and Cornelies VanDenBerg in Lodgepole, SD. He attended grade school in Perkins County, SD, and graduated from high school in Lead, SD, in 1951. He then enlisted in the U.S. Air Force and served during the Korean War until he was honorably discharged in 1955.

Peck, Diane (Rick) Bracha,


