Obituary

Edward Johnson was born February 26, 1916 in Madison Station, Mississippi, the second of five sons to the late Clarence and Pearl Johnson. He was married to Harriett Robinson Johnson for 52 years until her death on February 7, 2002. He was also preceded in death by his four brothers.

Edward left home at the age of 17 to obtain his high school education at Tuskegee Institute since his local “colored” school only went through 8th grade. He attended 4 years of high school and 4 years of college at Tuskegee Institute as a work-study student, graduating in 1942. By graduation he had already reported for his military duty in the Army Air Corps at Tuskegee. He got permission to walk back from the base to the campus to attend his commencement ceremony and receive his BS degree. He was accepted as an aviation cadet and did well in the program, but was washed out due to strict quotas on how many pilots could graduate in each class. He was valuable enough to be assigned to stay in the pilot program as a ground school instructor. He trained the student pilots to fly by instruments using a simulator called the Link Trainer. He attained the rank of sergeant, continuing as an instructor until after the war, and was discharged in December, 1945.



After his military service Edward pursued a career as an electrician in Atlanta, becoming the first black licensed Master Electrician in the city. In 1947 he started his own business, Johnson and Wood Electric Company, in partnership with a fellow Tuskegee graduate, the late Charles Wood, Sr. Upon retirement he closed the business and continued to do individual small jobs and worked with former employees on larger projects, including the wiring of the Marta train stations. He worked weekends at the Clark Atlanta University power plant for many years until illness forced him to stop at the age of 80. He spent his last years as a resident of Arbor Terrace at Cascade Assisted Living Facility.

Edward gave many years of faithful service to Friendship Baptist Church on the Deacon Board and the Usher Board. The church relied upon him for his electrical and heating expertise, especially in emergencies.

Edward was loved by his family and friends. He will be remembered as a soft spoken, dependable person with a surprising sense of humor. He leaves to cherish his memory, three daughters, Ms. Julie Johnson, Atlanta, Georgia, Mrs. Edna J. Sartor (Dr. Curtis J. Sartor, Jr.) Elgin, Illinois, and Mrs. Brenda J. Crawford (Reverend Ronald Crawford), Bowie, Maryland; half-brother, Clarence Johnson, Jr., Jackson, Mississippi; three grandsons, Vincent Crawford, Philip Crawford (Tasha), and Curtis Anthony Sartor, III (Nichole); five great grandchildren, a godson, Trent Floyd, and a host of other relatives and friends.
