A Glimpse into Her Life

Mother Evelyn Mills Statham silently slept away on Friday morning, January 30, 2026 after an extended period of illness.

Mother Statham was born July 16, 1935 in Fort Valley, Georgia to the late Mildred Mathews Mills and Lonnie Mills. Mother Statham worked at the Fort Valley State College Laundry and Building Grounds, One Hour Martinizing Cleaners (Manager), Bassett Furniture Company, and fully retired after working at the Community Plaza Store in Fort Valley.

Mother Statham and the late Deacon Warren G. Statham, Sr. were joined in Holy Matrimony on April 13, 1957 and renewed their vows on May 7, 1988, and to this union six children were born.

Evelyn was a member of Zellners Chapel First Born Church of the Living God from birth. She served as the Chairperson of the Deaconess Board at Zellner Chapel for over 30 years and served as the District and Diocese Deaconess of the Mighty Mid-South Diocese for many years and chaired most Pastoral Anniversaries and served on various committees for years to support the First Board Church of the Living God.
