And you were too busy to grant someone, what turned out to be their one last wish.

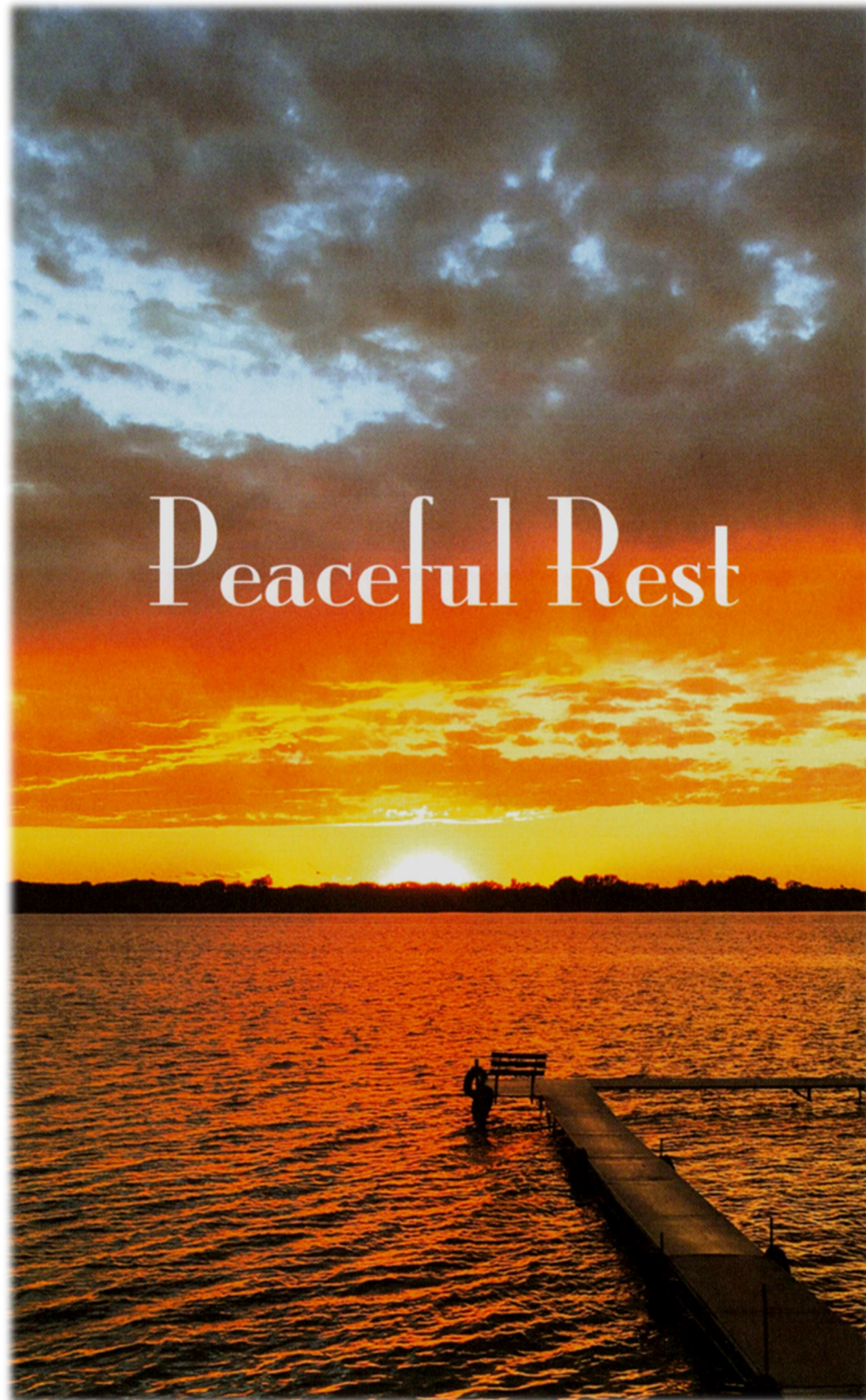
So hold your loved ones close today, and whisper in their ear,
