

Baby John was baptized into God's family on 11/26/1981. His child-hood was spent playing with Transformers and GI Joes and doing sweet canopeners off the high dive at the Willow Lake pool. Sundays were spent at grandma Sophie's house, engaged in various creative activities with the Kannegieter cousins such as: kill the carrier, Ol' Nelly, "Chop off heads", and setting booby traps for grandma in the basement. In high school, John played drums in the band and sang in the choir, participated in school plays, but his biggest love was football. He loved re-telling his big quarterback sack in the playoff game (I'm sure you've probably heard about it).

John attended SDSU, majoring in history and singing in the Statesmen's choir. One night in his 4th year, he met a girl that looked just like Julia Roberts, he called home to tell his mom he had met the girl he was going to marry.

After graduation, John and Megan took an unforgettable trip to Scotland and then he took his first job teaching history in Pollock, SD; where he lived for 2 years making a big impact in his short time there.

On April 21, 2007, John and Megan were married at First Presbyterian Church in Aberdeen. In August 2010, they welcomed their first child, Hazel Milly, and then Merritt John in 2013.
