

## **The Life and Legacy of Babatunde Olajide Onabanjo**

### **December 21, 1943 – January 16, 2026**

#### **Early Life and Education**

Babatunde Olajide Onabanjo was born on December 21, 1943, at the famous Mercy Children’s Hospital in Lagos, Nigeria, to the late Mr. George Adelanwa Onabanjo and Mrs. Esther Olubunmi Onabanjo (nee Osinowo). His formative years were spent between the vibrant streets of Lagos and the ancestral roots of Ode-Remo, Ogun State. He was blessed with the following siblings: Adesimbo (deceased), Oyejide, Modupeola, Olayemi and Abosede.

A naturally gifted student, Babatunde’s intellectual potential was recognized early by family and mentors alike. After completing his elementary education at Ode-Remo Methodist School (1950–1956), he attended Secondary Modern School in Sagamu from 1957 to 1960 while under the care of his maternal uncle, Rev. J.O. Onabote. Following his uncle’s passing, he was mentored by the Very Rev. E.O. Ogungbe, whose encouragement led Babatunde to Christ Apostolic Grammar School, Iperu. He eventually completed his secondary education at National High School, Ebute-Metta, Lagos in 1964.

#### **A Distinguished Career and Union Leadership**

In January 1965, Babatunde began what would become an illustrious career with Nigeria Airways Limited. Through dedication and a commitment to professional excellence, he pursued advanced certifications at Yaba College of Technology and the World Trade Centre Institute of Stores and Supply in New York (1980, 1982). His expertise led him to the position of Assistant Stores Manager within the Engineering Department of the national carrier.

Beyond his professional duties, Babatunde was a fierce advocate for his colleagues. He served with distinction in the Air Transport Workers Union, eventually rising to the position of President of the Lagos Branch, a role he held with integrity until his retirement from the airline in 1987.

#### **Faith and Spiritual Service**

A man of unwavering faith, Babatunde’s life was anchored in Christ through the Methodist Church Nigeria. He was a fully accredited Lay Preacher of the Yaba Circuit, a dedicated member of the Wesley Guild, and an active congregant at Methodist Church Nigeria, Oshodi.

Upon relocating to the United States in 1988, he continued his spiritual journey in Ohio, eventually becoming a pillar of Christ International Community Church (formerly the African Church in Columbus). His life was a testament to the Wesleyan tradition of service, and he remained a member in good standing until his transition to glory. He was also previously a member of the Reynoldsburg United Methodist Church (now Reynoldsburg Community Church) and Asbury United Methodist Church (South).

#### **Family and Personal Life**

In 1969, Babatunde met the love of his life, Ibidunni Olayemi Sofowora. They were united in holy matrimony on June 13, 1970, at the Methodist Church Cathedral, Agbeni, Ibadan. Their 42-year union was a partnership of profound strength, weathered by both joy and the tragic loss of their youngest son, Olugbenga Oyedele Onabanjo, in August 2003. He is survived by three children and their spouses – Adebowale Adedayo (Omolola) Onabanjo, daughter Olubanke Enitan (Femi) Igbalajobi and Adeleke Olakunle (Funmi) Onabanjo.

While Babatunde established a new chapter in the U.S., Ibidunni remained a steadfast pillar in Nigeria, raising their children with strong moral and spiritual foundations before joining him in 1998. Though Ibidunni preceded him in death in September 2012, her legacy remains central to the Onabanjo family story.

Babatunde, fondly known as “Good Mr. O,” was not only a devoted father to his children, but he was also a doting grandfather and a mentor to many, known for his positive spirit and infectious trust in the Lord.

## The Final Horizon

Even as health challenges arose in his later years, Babatunde's optimism never wavered. He celebrated his milestone 80<sup>th</sup> birthday in 2023 and his most recent 82<sup>nd</sup> birthday in December 2025 with songs of thanksgiving. Daddy always invited his family and friends to sing his favorite song of hope and assurance: "I will praise you Lord, with every breath that I take, I will praise you Lord, this promise I make, and should eternity end, I'll start all over again, even then I will praise you Lord."

On Friday, January 16, 2026, at 8:55pm, surrounded by the voices of his children singing hymns of praise, Babatunde passed away peacefully at Mt. Carmel Dublin Hospital. He took his final breath as he lived his life—in a state of worship.

He is survived by his children, grandchildren, siblings, and a host of extended family and friends who find comfort in the words of his favorite hymn by the Rev. Charles Wesley:

"And if our fellowship below  
In Jesus be so sweet  
What heights of rapture shall we know  
When round His throne we meet."
