for his name's sake.

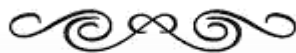
Even though I walk

in the presence of my enemies.

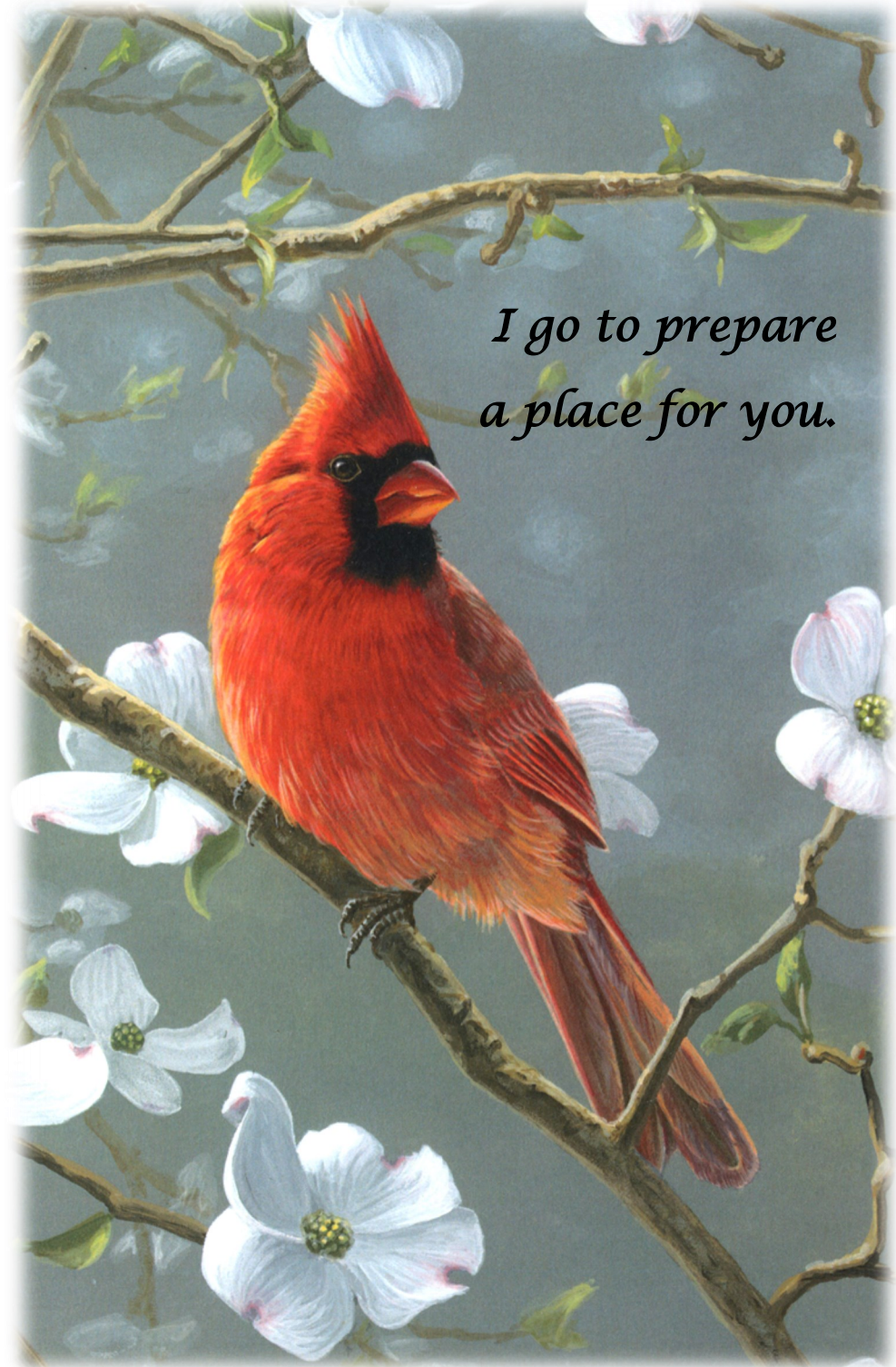
You anoint my head with oil;
